 - (e) What does "mind-forg'd manacles" mean in the poem "London"?
 - (f) How does the poem "A Beautiful Young Nymph Going to Bed" end?
 - (g) "Ne'er saw I, never felt a calm so deep!"— What prompts the poet to say so?
 - (h) "Corinna wakes. A dreadful sight! Behold the ruins of the night!"
 - What was the 'dreadful sight'?
 - (i) Why does the poet consider autumn as a season of abundance in "To Autumn"?
 - (j) "Himself in all, and all things in himself"—Explain.
