- (c) Discuss the motif of death with reference to the Lucy Poems.

OR

- (d) Comment on the imagery in "Daffodils".
- (e) Comment on the use of irony in "The Unknown Citizen".

OR

- (f) Bring out the thematic concerns in W. H. Auden's "Autumn Song".

2. Answer any *two* of the following questions:

10×2 = 20

- (a) Delineate the character of Oliver Bacon in "The Duchess and the Jeweller".

OR

- (b) Comment on the ending of Woolf's short story, "The Duchess and the Jeweller".
- (c) Evaluate Orwell's "Shooting an Elephant" as a critique of imperialism.

OR

- (d) Comment on the aptness of the title, "Shooting an Elephant".
- (e) Discuss the role of the shopkeeper in "The Magic Shop".

OR

- (f) Elaborate on the portrayal of the father-son relationship in "The Magic Shop".

(g) Comment on the use of irony in "Open Window".

OR

(h) Elucidate the significance of the Window in "Open Window".

(a) Discuss *Macbeth* as a Shakespearean tragic hero.

OR

(b) Examine the use of supernatural elements in *Macbeth*.

(c) Discuss the theme of love in *Twelfth Night*.

OR

(d) Comment on the character of Olivia.
